SERVICE DELIVERY

Record

- The IFP-led municipality managed to settle a debt of 5,5 million that was incurred by the previous ANC-led municipality
- Built the R1.8. million KwaGcaleka Taxi Rank
- Provided local women entrepreneurs with an opportunity to do business at the rank
- Undertook road construction through a grant of R21.7 million
- Built 11 water schemes and provided 23 water tanks at Ndulinde
- Built a library the Sundumbili Library at "Chappies"
- Built a bridge at Ernatsheketseni for R250 000.00 and as such provided access to the cemetery
- Built a community hall at Macambini for R2.5 million
- Facilitated for the resolution of the eviction of people at "Chappies"
- Initiated poverty alleviation programmes from which people received assistance such as hoes, seeds, tractors, sewing machines, trading or spaza shop containers
- Applied for and received financial assistance for the construction of low cost housing to be built this year
- Currently processing applications for assistance from indigent families
- Built a R1.7 million Sports field behind Sundumbili Plaza

 - We contribute towards the revival of the economy of the eNdongakusuka Municipal area

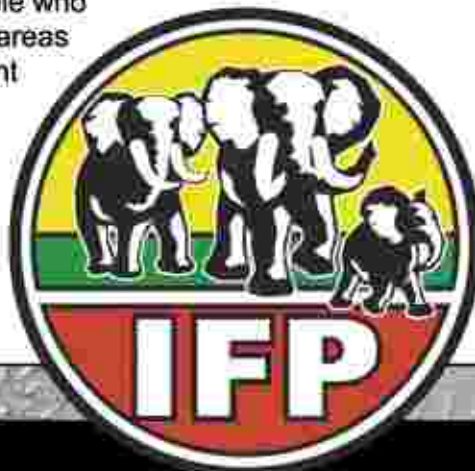
GOVERNANCE/LEADERSHIP
